





Fatima Sheikh: A Forgotten Figure in Indian history

(Biography)

Fatima Sheikh was an educator and social reformer, who was a colleague of the social reformers Jyotirao Phule and Savitribai Phule. She is widely considered to be India's first Muslim woman teacher. Fatima Sheikh was the sister of Mian Usman Sheikh, in whose house Jyotirao and Savitribai Phule took up residence.

One of the first Muslim women teachers of modern India, she started educating Bahujan children in Phules' school. On her 192nd birth anniversary, we remember the life and contributions of Fatima Sheikh. Fatima Sheikh, often a lost figure in Indian history, was a pioneering teacher, anti-caste activist, proponent of girls' education, and social reformer in 19th century Maharashtra. Along with Savitribai and Jyotirao Phule, she started the first girls' school in the country, in spite of loud, threatening opposition. On her 192nd birth anniversary, it's our duty to remember the oft-forgotten feminist icon and her story. Befriending Savitribai and starting a girls' school in Pune.

Fatima Sheikh befriended Savitribai when the two were enrolled in a teachers' training programme by American missionary Cynthia Farrar. While in the programme, both developed a bond over their politics and mission to educate those who had been traditionally denied knowledge and education. In 1848, Savitribai, Fatima and Jyotirao opened the first school for girls inside the premises of Fatima's home in Pune. Savitribai and Fatima took on the work of teaching a small group of girls there, with the help of Farrar, who at the time was based in Ahmednagar. Other schools for Dalits and women followed, with Fatima and Savitribai going to individual families across the town in attempts to persuade them into enrolling their children. Standing firm amidst fervent opposition.

However, in Pune, a conservative bastion of

Marathi culture and tradition, the very act of trying to educate the underprivileged caused uproar. It is said that the two women would often have stones and pieces of dung thrown at them while walking in the streets. Fatima specifically is said to have borne the wrath of both upper-caste Hindus and orthodox Muslims.

Under pressure from upper castes, Jyotirao's father evicted Savitribai and Jyotirao from the family home in the late 1840s. With nowhere else to go, the Phules would find shelter at the house of Mian Usman Sheikh, where they would live till 1856. As many from their own community abandoned them, Fatima Sheikh and her brother stood strongly with the Phules and the mission to educate girls and bahujans. Among the many admirers of Sheikh is Dr Mahino Fatima, an Indian neurobiologist. Mahino says she belongs to a cloth weaving family, which was historically denied access to education.

"How can I become a scientist if I have not attended a primary school? She brought up the idea that we can also study the curriculum which men read. The idea that girls and boys can have similar education was a huge step forward," she tells TRT World. Sheikh taught at various schools that the Phules ran over the years. Eventually her efforts paid off and girls from different castes and backgrounds who wouldn't otherwise socialise, sat under one roof to take their lessons. Phules and Sheikhs stressed on girls getting an education in mathematics, science and social studies. Within four years after Savitribai started the school, the girls enrollment was ten times higher than the number of boys studying at any government school in the area.

The impact of Fatima's collaboration with the Phules went beyond education. It was one of the earli-



est examples of when a Muslim joined hands with someone from a lower Hindu caste for a common cause.

Her achievements were partly recognised a few years back when the Maharashtra State Bureau included her brief bio in Urdu textbooks.

An elusive figure

Unfortunately, many details of Fatima Sheikh's life and pioneering work have been lost. Unlike the Phules, who left behind a treasure trove of literature in the form of personal diaries, notes, letters, poems and books, no surviving documents of Fatima Sheikh are available today. Even among Muslim icons, she is often forgotten, with figures such as Syed Ahmed Khan, who established the Aligarh Muslim University, dominating discourse on education and social reform.

However, while the details of Fatima Sheikh's life might not be as well known, what is indisputable is that she was a pioneering figure whose life, at a time when regressive attitudes towards women and bahujans pervaded society, is a testimony to her courage. Remembering her today.

"Fatima Sheikh continues to fight for her rightful place in history." In 202, Fatima Shaikh was honoured with a Google Doodle on her birthday. Today, some state governments have included her mention in their history or political science syllabi.

the solar wind. Our star sheds around 1.3 trillion trillion particles every second. This equates to roughly one billion kilograms of matter per second, or one Earth every 185 million years.

7. Vast amounts of water have been found in space:

Earth's oceans may not be that unique. Three of Jupiter's moons (Europa, Ganymede, and Callisto) and two of Saturn's (Enceladus (pictured above) and Titan) are thought to have underwater seas. Europa's ocean may contain over twice the volume of water found on Earth. However, the most water ever discovered surrounds a black hole some 12 billion lightyears away. This region contains vast amounts of water vapour, the equivalent of 140 trillion times the volume of water in Earth's oceans.

8. The Moon is getting farther away every year:

The Moon exerts a pull on Earth, causing our planet to be slightly egg-shaped. It affects water even more, creating tides and causing the oceans to pile up towards one side of the planet, forming a 'tidal bulge'. This bulge is dragged around with the Moon as it orbits. As Earth rotates faster than the Moon - 24 hours versus 27.3 days - the bulge moves slightly ahead of the Moon's position in orbit. The Moon pulls back on it, effectively trying to slow it down and causing Earth's rotation rate to gradually slow down over time as a result. As the two bodies interact through gravity, this tugging causes Earth to lose energy while the Moon gains energy. Because of this energy boost the Moon is slowly spiralling outwards, moving away from us by 3.8cm per year.

9. Uranus is the coldest planet in the Solar System:

One of the big mysteries about Uranus is that it doesn't give out much heat. Uranus is the coldest planet in the Solar System, with temperatures in its cloud tops averaging -224°C.

10. Black holes have theoretical opposites known as white holes:

Black holes are known for their voracious appetites; their influence is so strong that even light can't escape their gravity. But they have a theoretical converse - white holes. They are effectively the opposite of their dark relatives, spitting out light and matter instead of trapping it. So far, they are purely hypothetical objects; astronomers are contemplating how they could form in reality.



ROSE GARDEN

I loved this point. The Rose Garden is a prominent attraction of Ooty visited by thousands of travellers round the year. Spread over an area of 10 acres, the orchard is one of the biggest rose gardens in India. Arranged in curved terraces, the rose orchard houses more than hundred varieties of roses including miniature roses, hybrid tea roses, ramblers and much more. Many of the rose species were brought from several parts of the world including Australia.

THUNDER WORLD

A popular amusement park, the Thunder World is a prominent tourist destination in Ooty that attracts thousands of travellers all through the year. Often referred to as the Dinosaur Park, Thunder World houses models of several species of Dinosaurs. Needless to say, the park is highly enjoyed by kids. Alternately, the use of sound and technology make the park seem like one-of-its-kind in Ooty.

MURUGAN TEMPLE and CAIRN HILL

At the end of the journey I saw Lord Murugan, the temple is located at Elk Hill. The biggest attraction here happens to be the 42-feet tall golden-coloured statue of Lord Murugan which is equally awe-inspiring. Since it is located on the Elk Mountains, the area offers amazing views of the surrounding vistas. After that I witnessed the beauty of Cairn Hill, Located far from the madding crowd, the Cairn Hills are probably the least explored region of Ooty. Surrounded by dense forests all around, the Cairn Hills are home to some of the best resorts in Ooty where high-end tourists often end up spending a relaxing weekend. Alternately, Cairn Hills is a great place to simply hang out or spend some time in the evening strolling around.

As a hill station, Ooty enjoys a cool and pleasant climate round the year. However, the best time to visit happens to be the summer months - from early March to early June, when the weather is absolutely at its best. Ooty enjoys moderate rainfall during the monsoons and winters are not too harsh either. Though temperature may fall to 2°C or 3°C, despite that, exploring Ooty in winters has its own charm.
